FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Each October is set aside by the bishops of the United States as Respect Life Month, a time to reflect particularly on life issues and to pray for and promote great respect for all human life.

Imagine yourself pausing in front of a beautiful work of art. Now think of the artist who created that masterpiece with painstaking care and precision, stepping back to admire his work. Each of us is a masterpiece, created by God with purpose and tenderness. We are each loved so intensely and are each of such great worth that we cannot fully comprehend it.

Pope Francis, who has captivated the world with his humility and compassion, shows us through his actions that "even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God's creation, made in his own image, destined to live forever, and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect" (2013 Day of Life Greeting).

We want to be part of a society which has the determination and protection of human rights as its primary objective and boast. Yet many of those who are weak and vulnerable are pushed to the periphery of society. For example, a large percentage of children pre-diagnosed as having Down syndrome are never given the chance to live outside their mothers' wombs.

There is the true story of Barbara Wagner, a retired school bus driver who had been in remission from her lung cancer. When it recurred, her oncologist wanted her to be given a drug that statistically would increase the change of her being alive in one year by 45%. The State of Oregon denied this treatment stating that her prognosis wasn't good enough to warrant expensive medication to treat her cancer. Yet in the same letter denying coverage for her medication, the State offered full coverage (100%) for her physician assisted suicide. What a strange and twisted irony!

The Lord is inviting us to respond. We are all called to act, not with anxiety or with doubt, but with confident trust in and dependence on God. We are called to care for ourselves and others. We are called to witness, in our own way, to the powerful and life-transforming love of Christ and to the respect and reverence that is due to each person as a "masterpiece of God's creation."

How is God calling you to witness to these truths in your daily life?

Walk a mile in their shoes

Our nation's is not the first immigration crisis in history. Consider the Israelites suffering in Egypt before their grand exodus. God reminds them of their own past: "You shall not molest or oppress an alien, for you were once aliens yourselves." The influx of people seeking a better life in the United States is problematic on many levels, but whatever solution is worked out, it must be just, and our attitude as Christians should never disdain immigrants—"legal" or not. God's attitude is clear: "If ever you wrong [the widow or orphan] and they cry out to me, I will surely hear their cry." Even as we work for the rule of law we may never "wrong" any person in the process. Our compassion must mirror God's.

TODAY'S READINGS: Exodus 22:20-26; 1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10; Matthew 22:34-40 (148). "If he cries out to me, I will hear him; for I am compassionate."

MONDAY, OCTOBER 27

Light up your life!

As days get shorter, it's helpful to remember the importance of light. Light helps growth and vision. *In light of* certain information, you can make better decisions; *with a light heart*, you can rejoice in others' good news. "Live as children of light," Saint Paul wrote. That means being free enough to see and be seen by others, being humble enough to free others through forgiveness, and being aware enough to live with gratitude for all you've been given. In essence, it means living a life befitting eternal life—a life that's a light to the world.

TODAY'S READINGS: Ephesians 4:32-5:8; Luke 13:10-17 (479). "For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord."

FEAST OF SIMON AND JUDE, APOSTLES

God is shaping us up

The American Catholic website reminds us that "holiness does not depend on human merit, culture, personality, effort, or achievement. It is entirely God's creation and gift." God makes saints of whomever God chooses. An important lesson especially when one of today's saints, Simon the Zealot, in his own day would have been considered a terrorist! Jesus is not endorsing religious extremism, but Simon being chosen to follow Jesus reminds us that we are all in God's hands and are being shaped and re-shaped by those loving hands.

TODAY'S READINGS: Ephesians 2:19-22; Luke 6:12-16 (666). "Jesus went up to the mountain to pray and he spent the night in prayer to God."

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 29

Discipline is good practice

Obedience is a discipline. For a child, it means honoring your parents by listening well and acting respectfully. With age and wisdom comes a deeper understanding of obedience. Mature obedience is the call to listen attentively to and for God in everything. This means coming to know the voice of God through prayer and reflection and being willing to respond openly to God's call wherever it may lead you. That's not always an easy task, but ultimately such obedience is the discipline of discipleship—a call rooted in freedom, fidelity, and love. Are you ready to give it a shot?

TODAY'S READINGS: Ephesians 6:1-9; Luke 13:22-30 (481). "Strive to enter through the narrow gate."

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 30

Mightier than the sword

The Old and New Testaments abound with vivid imagery of epic war between good and evil, with Michael the Archangel often leading the forces of heaven. The church teaches that Michael is also a model of a spiritual warrior who battles evil within. He also accompanies souls at the time of death. In all of these roles, he is the guardian of the church. In 1886, Pope Leo XIII introduced the Prayer to Saint Michael, which begins: "Blessed Michael, Archangel, defend us in the hour of conflict; be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares of the devil." Be grateful for all the angels—celestial or otherwise—in your life.

TODAY'S READINGS: Ephesians 6:10-20; Luke 13:31-35 (482). "Draw your strength from the Lord and from his mighty power."

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 31

The way to see in the dark

Halloween reminds us that the world can be a scary place with darkened doors and creepy creatures. But nothing is more scary than the worries and frets that rattle around in our own skulls. Don't let the fear of what could go wrong prevent you from embracing what is right. Jesus never let the threat of another's scorn stop him from a compassionate act. As Saint Francis says, "Where there is charity and wisdom, there is neither fear nor ignorance." When gloom and doom set in, gather your courage and walk toward the Light.

TODAY'S READINGS: Philippians 1:1-11; Luke 14:1-6 (483). "Jesus spoke to the scholars of the law and Pharisees in reply, asking, 'Is it lawful to cure on the sabbath or not?'"

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 1

SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS

Saints alive!

What does it mean to belong to God? We can look to the example of the saints, whose lives witness to the great power of love. Among them are saints, such as the early martyrs who we know from legends told over centuries. You may know many other saints more personally—holy people you've met in your own lifetimes. Maybe they were the peacemakers in a troubled neighborhood, the person at work with unshakeable kindness, the student who respected everyone. On this Solemnity of All Saints, spend time in prayer with a saint whose love has made an impression on your life.

TODAY'S READINGS: Revelation 7:2-4, 9-14; 1 John 3:1-3; Matthew 5:1-12a (667). "I heard the number of those who had been marked with the seal . . . from every tribe of the children of Israel."
