Loreto Finance Committee Meeting

At its meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 15 the Loreto Finance Committee reviewed the report submitted by Joe Sama, parish bookkeeper, for the fiscal year ending 8/31/15. It shows Total Receipts of \$197,654 and Total Disbursements of \$211,347, a deficit of \$13,693. Cash available in checking and savings accounts is \$5,152 with a total outstanding debt balance of \$623,719, \$521,994 of which is the loan on the Parish Center. Joe will summarize the report for parishioners at Masses on Sept. 26 and 27 and a paper copy of the report will be inserted in the bulletin.

The Committee decided to market the Parish Center as a location for satellite campuses for area colleges. The Committee will also investigate the feasibility of selling land on Massasoit Rd. for two more housing units. The numbers in the report make clear that we desperately need to increase our weekly offertory. Our weekly need in order to meet all financial obligations is around \$5,000. Our average weekly offertory is just a bit over half of that. These efforts are made necessary to compensate the parish for all of the lost revenue (about \$50,000 per year) associated with Bingo.

The Committee decided to have a "C-Note" Sunday to collect money to pay for roof work on the Parish Center. Damage was done last winter as a result of ice dams. The cost for this work over and above the insurance settlement is in the \$9,000 - \$10,000 range. The parish doesn't have the money to pay for that work, which must be done before cold weather settles in. The "C-Note" effort would also raise money for emergency electrical work just completed in the Boiler Room and for the recently completed fire alarm system update required by the city. In both cases, emergency loans from the Chancery paid for the work since the parish didn't have the money and the cost was added to our indebtedness. Msgr. Pedone will send out a letter about the "C-Note" Sunday, which will take place in mid-October.

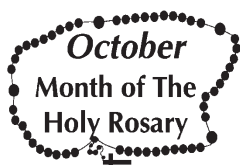

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION

Children in public schools or non-Catholic private schools and academics should be attending religious education classes on a yearly basis. Candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation **must** attend classes for two years (Grade 9 and Grade 10.)
