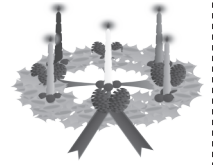

O Antiphons

The Roman Church has been singing the "O" Antiphons since at least the 8th century. They are the antiphons that accompany the *Magnificat* canticle of Evening Prayer from December 17-23. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming of Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but present ones as well. Their repeated use of the imperative "Come!" embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah.

- December 17 **O Wisdom of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!**
- December 18 **O Leader of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!**
- December 19 **O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay!**

Gaudete Sunday

Gaudete Sunday is the 3rd Sunday of Advent. The Introit for Gaudete Sunday is taken from Philippians 4:4,5: “Gaudete in Domino semper” (“Rejoice in the Lord always”). On Gaudete Sunday, having passed the midpoint of Advent, the Church lightens the mood a little, and the priest wears rose vestments. The change in color provides us with encouragement to continue our spiritual preparation—especially prayer and fasting—for Christmas. For the same reason, the third candle of the Advent wreath, first lit on Gaudete Sunday, is rose-colored.
