FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends,

I have some bittersweet news to share with you. Deacon Paul Audette recently informed me that he wants to retire from ministry to our parish community, effective Labor Day weekend, September 1st and 2nd. He has served our parish zealously and with great devotion as deacon and pastoral associate since he began his ministry here in 2002. I will miss him very much and I know you will, also. However, he feels the time is right for him to enter into a new dimension of his life, which will allow him to spend more time with his wife, Marilyn, and their family. He certainly has earned it! *Ad multos annos, Deacon Paul!*

Recently, our parish was the recipient of a gift from the estate of Ann Moreschi, who died in December of 2016, in the amount of \$71,075.35. This gift is in addition to the bequest we received from the Agnes Gallo estate for \$116,103.29. Some of this money will be used to replace the roofs of the church, rectory and garage and to replace the windows at the Loreto rectory, which are in bad shape. I am planning to install a handicap accessible bathroom in the side room in the vestibule of the church and am investigating the possibility of installing central air conditioning in the church.

I am grateful to all who were so generous to our parish in their wills and estate planning. May God bless you for your kindness and foresight.

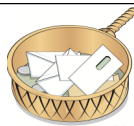
The Coffee Shop is open today for the last time this season.
